When I first arrived in Taiwan, the most impressive thing was that the whole city is very beautiful. There have many night markets in Taiwan. Although these night markets are always very crowded and noisy, but there will be no garbage on the ground. People will consciously hold the garbage they eat until throw them in the garbage can. In addition, the whole people in Taiwan have implemented the policy of reducing plastic waste and paid great attention to environmental protection. People in Taiwan are also very polite and orderly, such as bus culture. All buses in Taiwan have "priority seats". These seats will always be reserved for those who need them, and generally will not be occupied. Of course, no one on the bus will eat, talk or affect other passengers.

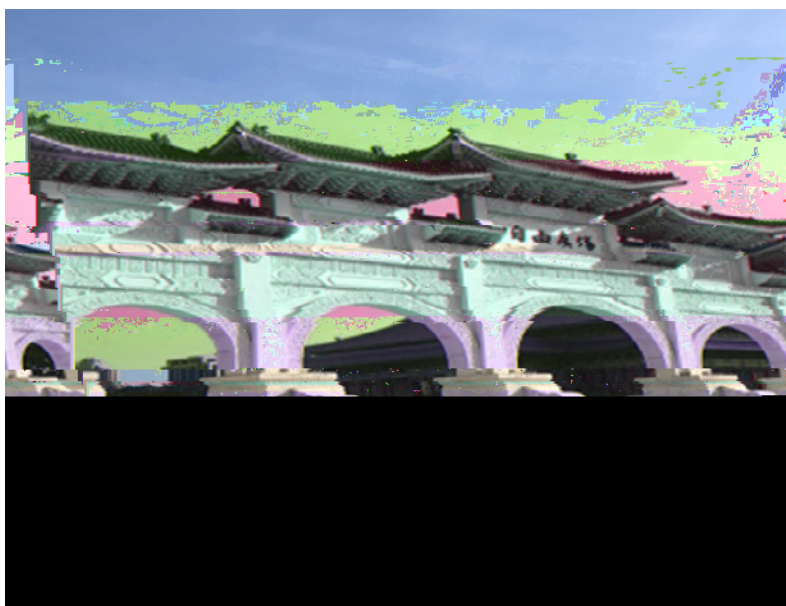
Next, I would like to talk about school life in Taiwan. Although the curricula in Taiwan and Japan are very similar, there still have some differences, for example, Taiwan pays more attention to the oral presentation than the normal examination. The final examination may only account for 40% of the total score, but the final or ordinary presentation can account for 60% of the total score. I think this way can train students to use their own way to express after consulting data, and help students learn more knowledge.

There are few courses in Taiwan, and only can take about 12-25 credits a semester, so the students are more relaxed. The school usually organizes some extracurricular activities. When I passing through the playground or activity center, I can often see that a lot of clubs are doing some activities.

In addition to learning, of course, I will travel to feel the impact of Taiwan Culture when I have free time. Taiwan is a small place, but there have many beautiful places and unique scenic spots to visit. One of my favorite beautiful places in Taiwan is Hualien's Tailuge park. The streams in Tailuge park are very clear and we also can see the vast sea and green trees, as well as friendly native Taiwanese in this park. Taiwan is very small, from the northernmost to the southernmost, it is only about a thousand miles. Some students will choose to travel around the island by motorcycle, and it took me three days to travel around the island by train. Along the way, I saw many beautiful sceneries with Taiwan characteristics.

The last part is about the food culture in Taiwan. There are many different but delicious food in Taiwan, and the price is generally much cheaper than that in Japan. Taiwan's night market culture also has attracted a lot of tourists, because all kinds of Taiwan food will be found in the night market.

During the period of studying in Taiwan, I realized many cultural differences, and also learned knowledge that I couldn't learn in Japan through the classes in school. In general, I have gained a lot from all aspects, and I think this study abroad experience will also be a wonderful memory that I will never forget in my life.
